Whether you're sailing the turquoise seas of the Caribbean or plying the ice-packed waters of the Arctic, our exclusive undersea program reveals the wonders hidden beneath the waves. Each voyage features an undersea specialist who dons diving gear or deploys a Remotely Operated Vehicle (ROV) to document the marine environment, feeding live footage to the ship lounge so you can glimpse fascinating sea creatures and their oceanic habitats.

Developing Young Explorers

The National Geographic Global Explorers Program is an exclusive educational adventure for guests

under 18 years of age. This hands-on, interactive program uses the natural world as a classroom in the Galápagos, Alaska, Baja California, and Antarctica. Onboard field educators teach kids to



explore like scientists through engaging activities, from learning to identify whale flukes to catching plankton and examining it under a microscope, and young explorers also have the opportunity to get a Zodiac driver's license.



At Home on the High Seas

As a former international chef with a restaurant resume that reads like a map of the world, Ana Esteves brings her deep knowledge of the globe's cuisines and cultures to her role as Vice President of Hotel Operations for Lindblad Expeditions. We asked Ana-who was recently recognized as one of the United States Tour Operators Association's "Future Lights of the Tour Industry"-to describe how she and her team consider every detail to make you feel truly at home and deepen your connection to the places we explore so that your time on the ship is as meaningful as your time on shore.

I travel around the world for my job and in my experience it's easiest to connect with a place when you feel welcome there. At Lindblad Expeditions-National Geographic, we define luxury as genuine comfort, and this value translates to an onboard experience that is truly friendly. Guests should feel like they can strike up a conversation with any crew member and tell them about the iceberg they saw or the sea lion they swam with and that crew member will be interested and excited for them! That sense of comfort helps travelers feel at ease with one another as well, and it's part of the reason why, time and again, we see such strong communities form onboard.


The food we serve comes from the very lands and waters we explore. If you have a slice of banana bread for breakfast on one of our Costa Rica expeditions, the bananas used to make that bread are endemic to the country. We're able to do this because we build relationships with local farmers, and our chefs harvest ingredients alongside them. This helps us to establish a real connection through the cuisine and to understand what is culinarily important to the region both historically and today—and we can pass what we learn on to our guests.

Strong relationships with locals also help us uphold our commitment to sustainability which is a guiding principle for us. We know the exact fields and forests your food is coming from, and we reduce waste by asking our providers to reduce the food and plastic waste in our collaborative processes. These standards extend beyond the dining room. We use sustainable products wherever possible, from the bath amenities in your personal guest suite to the spa treatments in our shared wellness spaces. When your surroundings and experiences are 'of the land,' immersion in your destination comes naturally. The art in the corridors, the cabin cushions, and the table flowers—they all reflect the heritage of the regions you're visiting. Everything you taste, see, feel everything you experience onboard should tell the story of the land and its people.

Choose Your Own Adventure



on a farm in Northeast Texas led to Shaun Powell's lifelong fascination with the natural world, but it was his quest for

adventure that brought him to Lindblad. A 25-year veteran with degrees in marine biology and journalism, Shaun is adamant that his real education has been on the job—as purser, pastry chef, naturalist, and expedition leader, to name a few. Now Director of Field Staff, Shaun is perfectly positioned to share with us what makes for an 'active exploration,' how exactly we are able to access such remote locations. and more insider insights.

At Lindblad-National Geographic, we are known for what we call 'active exploration.' How would you explain this concept?

Active exploration is when you get out there and maximize the experience. You don't simply observe, take a photo, and return to the coach or ship—you might go kayaking on your own, at your own speed, soaking in the environment. Or perhaps you take a walk with one of our naturalists, learning every little detail about that area's ecosystem. Or you could visit an ancient cultural site where you learn how people lived there. It is a more intimate and connected way to travel.

What are the various tools we use for active exploration?

We are constantly researching the latest and most innovative technology, and we deploy numerous tools and toys to enhance the expedition experience. We have an onboard photo gear locker and spotting scopes are strategically positioned on the ship so we can spot, track and safely approach wildlife. Sonar equipment helps us go to remote locations where other ships don't dare go, and through years of research we know that a Zodiac is the best vehicle for expedition cruising. For the undersea program, Remotely Operated Vehicles (ROVs) access depths of the ocean that divers can't reach on their own, and hydrophones allow us to listen in on whales beneath the ship.

How does the field staff help differentiate an expedition from a cruise?

On an expedition you have the advantage of the team that is traveling alongside you. You aren't left to your own devices or your own initiative. The experienced group of naturalists, professors, scientists, and scholars are there to help facilitate your connection to the environment.

How does the size of our ships enable us to explore the way we do?

The small scale of our ships serves a few different purposes. On an interpersonal



level, it allows you to get to know everyone onboard. We are also able to maximize each experience. While whale watching, for example, instead of watching from eight decks up on a large ship, we get everyone out on Zodiacs, where you're at water level with your own little group of whales. It blows people's minds. On top of that, we can go where large ships simply cannot. With our sonar and skilled captains, our vessels can access remote shorelines that are not outfitted with docks and jetties.

How do we accommodate guests who prefer a slower pace or who are less comfortable with vigorous activities?

It's true that we go to some remote destinations, but we always have safety and comfort in mind, and all activities are created to suit varied desires, comfort levels, and abilities. Plus, each vessel's embarkation and disembarkation platform is designed to accommodate all capabilities. Adventure awaits for all!

Here, he shares some of his top tips for expedition photography so you'll be ready to zoom in the moment you step on board. The best souvenirs are the ones you make yourself—and there's no one better to help you create stunning pictures of the places we explore than National Geographic photography experts and our certified photo instructors. Through our exclusive expedition photography program, one of these experts joins every voyage to give guests hands-on instruction on how to frame a Norwegian fjord or leverage the glow of the golden hour in the Galápagos. Whether you're learning the fundamentals or perfecting your portfolio, our expeditions allow you to pursue your passion for photography in some of the most picturesque places on Earth.

Look for the Establishing Shot

Visually telling the story of your expedition starts by conveying an overall sense of place. You want a striking image that captures the essence of the destination and helps answer the question, "**Where did you go on your expedition?**"

Use Your Smartphone

As the image quality of smartphone cameras has improved, their use for expedition photography has grown exponentially. You don't need a ton of fancy equipment to get a memorable shot, and **many travelers are now using their smartphones to photograph expeditions**.





Be Ready for Action

Capturing wildlife behavior and movement may be the most challenging aspect of shooting on expedition. You can increase your odds of success by **setting the camera to burst mode** which captures multiple frames with a fast shutter speed—then pre-focus where the action is likely to happen.

Embrace the Photographer's Mantra

Heading out with my camera, I always think of this mantra: **light, composition, moment**. I look for provocative light, create a strong composition, then wait for a sense of the moment.





Zoom to Simplify the Frame

The most impactful images are often simple by design. **Zoom lenses offer flexibility** when it comes to crafting different compositions and eliminate distracting elements from the scene, especially when taking photographs from the deck of a ship.

The Unique Allure of Epic Voyages

President and co-chair of the board, **Sven Lindblad**, remembers vividly the impact of his first epic voyage. Here he explains how the legacy of 'going epic' is proudly carried on in one-of-a-kind experiences across great swaths of our planet, much to the delight of loyal guests.

Fifty years ago, my first seagoing expedition was a 35-day voyage from New Zealand, down through the sub-Antarctic Islands to the ice-choked Ross Sea, along vast unknown west Antarctica to the Antarctic peninsula and, eventually, through the Drake Passage to Ushuaia in Argentina. Looking back now, it was certainly one of the most rewarding experiences. With time, you fall into a rhythm of comradery with fellow explorers, where the mind-blowing days mesh with simple days at sea where you can catch your breath. Anticipation for the next landfall builds, and palpable excitement takes over the ship as a new place to be discovered emerges on the horizon.

We tend to rush a lot. Time is rarely a gift we give ourselves. We used to create a greater number of longer expeditions but found that people did not seem to want to devote the time. Life's pace seemed to have gotten more hectic. But I sense that is changing and people are rethinking their personal relationship to time.

So, here we are—embracing opportunities to slow down our pace and enjoy a greater arc of experience. We call them Epic Voyages because of their scope and rewards that come with the gift of time.

These voyages span the globe. From crossing the entire Atlantic Ocean on a 9,000 nautical mile, replicating the voyage to Antarctica from New Zealand to Argentina I made 50 years ago, to a deep dive into the culture, wildlife, and remarkable undersea of Indonesia, Raja Ampat, and Papua New Guinea.

On all of these voyages there is so much to see and, of course, learn. I have always believed that travel is the best way to learn about and better understand our world. And on Epic Voyages, that's true in spades. A final note—shared purpose really is the essence of any successful endeavor, as you well know. And that, in many ways, is the magic I believe exists on our expeditions across the globe. We really are in this together, from the captain to the officers, crew, expedition staff, and guests. It's an idea we have fostered since inception.

Expedition travel should be a joyful and wonderous experience for all aboard our ships—a shared one which makes our lives infinitely more interesting.

The Lindblad Expeditions-National Geographic fleet comprises ten expedition vessels and five seasonally leased ships, each embodying its own unique spirit of exploration. From intrepid vessels built to inspire a sense of adventure, to a four-masted ship that evokes the splendor of a bygone era, and a pair of state-of-the-art ice class vessels that feature extraordinary installations of original artwork inspired by the polar regions, the ships in our fleet are as diverse and dynamic as the places we explore. While their offerings are varied, key features unite our vessels: comfortable, well-appointed cabins, lively social spaces designed to foster a sense of community, cuttingedge exploration tools, and ship capacities that never exceed 81 cabins. National Geographic Endurance & National Geographic Resolution

National Geographic Endurance and *National Geographic Resolution* are next-generation expedition ships, purpose-built for polar navigation. Fully stabilized, highly strengthened, ice-class Polar Code PC5 (Category A) vessels, they are designed to navigate polar passages year-round, and safely explore uncharted waters, while providing exceptional comfort. The patented X-bow[®] is key to their design; its powerful wave-slicing action provides an extremely smooth ride even in adverse conditions, and even reduces spray on deck for superior observation. They carry a full suite of expedition tools, and offer a variety of experience enhancing amenities.

PUBLIC AREAS: Observation lounge with bar, three dining areas, gym, wellness area, infinity-style outdoor hot tubs, library, main lounge with full service bar, 24-hour beverage, state-of-the-art facilities for films, slideshows and presentations, and a photo workshop area; plus, an expedition base with lockers for expedition gear, and an "open Bridge" for access to our captain, officers and the art of navigation.

MEALS: Two restaurants, featuring local, sustainable choices and unassigned seating for flexible, inclusive dining; plus a Chef's table for intimate, small group dining. Main restaurant has 270° views, and the Observation deck restaurant features lighter, made-to-order fare.



National Geographic Explorer is a state-of-the-art expedition ship. It is a fully stabilized, ice-class vessel, with an ice-reinforced hull, enabling it to navigate polar passages while providing exceptional comfort. It carries kayaks and a fleet of Zodiacs. An undersea specialist operates a remotely operated vehicle (ROV) and sophisticated video equipment, extending access to the underwater world.

PUBLIC AREAS: Bistro bar; chart room; restaurant; global gallery; library; lounge with full service bar and state-of-the-art facilities for films, slideshows and presentations; mudroom with lockers for expedition gear, and observation lounge. Our "open Bridge" provides guests an opportunity to meet our officers and captain and learn about navigation.





Sea Cloud


CAPACITY: 58 guests in 30 cabins REGISTRY: Malta. OVERALL LENGTH 360 feet.

Built in 1931 by Wall Street businessman E. F. Hutton for his wife, Marjorie Merriweather Post, *Sea Cloud* carries 30 sails measuring a total of 32,000 square feet. *Sea Cloud*, the last of the private tall ships, is the destination, regardless of which destination she explores. She spends the winter sailing the trade winds of the Caribbean and heads to the Mediterranean in the summer.

PUBLIC AREAS: The covered Lido Bar is a superb place to congregate and enjoy the outdoors. The open-air "Blue Lagoon" is a wonderful place to relax. There is a sumptuous lounge and guests are welcome on the "open Bridge" to learn how *Sea Cloud* is navigated and sailed.

MEALS: Served in single seatings and in a casual setting, meals focus on local and Continental cuisine. Wines are included at lunch and dinner. Refreshments are always available.

CABINS: The Main Deck cabins have antique and periodstyle furniture. These cabins are the ship's original cabins, including the owner's suites originally occupied by E.F. 




